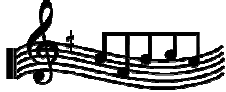

ORGANIST'S NOTES



The Voluntary after the service today will be the Tiento on the 6th Tone, which is anonymous in the source, a MS dated 1695 probably compiled in north Portugal and now conserved in Oporto. A short fugal opening is followed by sections of echo-like writing alternating with toccata-like passages before the triple-time section which is chordal with emphasis on rhythmic changes.
